KATE

I thought maybe I'd have a better chance of getting promoted to his project at work if I knew him outside of work. But...there was this one day, during practice, when we took a snack break. I was sitting in a circle in the grass with these five-year-olds. I was trying to open one of those bananas where the stem just bends, but it doesn't open, and it just turns to mush inside. And this little guy next to me put his hand on mine, really gently and said, "No, Mr. Ben, you have to *peel* it." And he mimed peeling a banana, because in his mind I had somehow made it to adulthood without figuring out how to peel a banana, and he was going to teach me how. And then he rested his head on my shoulder, and...something happened inside of me. I can't explain it. I could feel something shift, and...I knew wanted to be a dad more than anything.
